Spotlight on ... Platinum Sustaining Sponsor GHX

When wildfires scorched Louisville, CO, back in December, making news nationally and globally, there was never any doubt nor hesitation that the staff and leadership at GHX would get involved with rescue and relief, regardless of their proximity to the flames.



GHX headquarters resides within the circle above, near a residential neighborhood destroyed by the December wildfires that swept through parts of Colorado.

Experiencing and enduring a crisis or disaster can be excruciating, but it also can draw out the best in people and organizations.

GHX, a Bellwether League Foundation Platinum Sustaining Sponsor, represents a prime example of generosity and goodwill as they were involved in supporting recovery efforts – both financially and physically with available space and labor, according to Bruce Johnson, GHX President & CEO.

In addition to running GHX, Johnson also serves as Chairman of the Board of Trustees for A Precious Child (APC), a Colorado nonprofit organization located 15 minutes from the GHX office that has clothing and daily essentials it has been distributing to more than 1,000 families who lost homes as well as to hundreds of others who could not access their homes due to power and electricity being shut off. "APC was very heavily utilized by FEMA during the '500-year flood' experienced in 2013, so we are leaning in heavily with

American Red Cross and A Precious Child," Johnson told BLF's REMEMBER in an exclusive interview. "Lots to do and great response from our employees to help out!"

As if dealing with pandemic protocols weren't enough, now the local citizens were tested with additional hurdles.

"On top of an already challenging year, the Marshall and Middle Fork fires were devastating for families living in Superior, Louisville and unincorporated Boulder County, including many GHX employees. Gratefully, all our employees still have a home standing, but there has been smoke damage to some

homes as well as a lack of electricity, water and gas," Johnson said. "Our headquarters in Louisville did not sustain any permanent damage, but the office remains closed. Our focus is on ensuring our employees and their families have a safe and comfortable place to live as well as aiding the community in its extensive recovery efforts."

To assist the impacted communities, GHX donated to the Colorado Region Red Cross, the Boulder County Wildfire Fund and A Precious Child, according to Johnson. They also opened a matching gift program where GHX agreed to match employee donations to the relief organizations through the end of February. "Beyond financial aid, we are coordinating with local organizations for when they are ready to receive volunteers," he added.

A Precious Child also has been making a clear difference.

"A Precious Child has a long history of stepping up in the wake of disaster," Johnson said. "They assisted FEMA and Boulder County in helping families displaced by the 2013 floods. They are now working with more than 500 agency partners, including FEMA and Boulder County Health and Human Services, to identify and serve residents who have been impacted by the fires. The APC team has been gathering new and gently used clothing, gift cards and other essentials for people who have lost their belongings and are making these items available at their primary Resource Center, free of charge. Additionally, APC donors and board members have created a \$750,000 matching fund for donations made in the first quarter of 2022. This funding will support the expanded demand for APC's services between helping the families that were impacted by the fires in Boulder County as well as the eight Denver Metro counties the organization already assists."

Johnson views what happened as a curious punctuation mark to yet another challenging year.

"This wasn't the way any of us imagined closing out 2021 and starting the new year, but our community is filled with kind-hearted, determined people who are eager to help one another. It may take time, but the community will heal," he assured.
